Dear Miss Black;

I have written to Mrs North to tell her that we have fixed the 7th May as the date of our going to Oudtshoorn. We have decided that on our way through Humansdorp we will find out all we can about the paintings there so that we can do them on our return journey.

I am sending paintings from Mountain Top ^{sayamine} Mr. Bowker's farm which is twenty seven miles north west of Grahamstown also two sheets from Blaauwkrantz Drip, eighteen miles east, that is eighteen miles along the Port Alfred road.

The paintings at Mountain Top are, I think, very interesting; especially the sheep which Mr Bowker says is an old Cape sheep now hardly seen in South Africa. The black figures seem to be the oldest, the hands looking fairly recent though they could not be less than about 80 years old because ^{grand.} they farm originally belonged to Mr Bowker's father & Mr Bowker is a man of about 50 or 60 years of age.



one might think that it is strange that the Bushmen
shored up their paintings so high above the river
but it is quite obvious when one is told that
during the Xmas vac, when we had all those rains,
that the flood water actually washed the floor of
the caves.

We have not yet been to Alice Dale or Salem
but I believe Mr Hewitt is anxious to take us to &
as he has been away for a fortnight - we have had
to wait for him.

The more we do the more there seem to be
for us to do. I have heard of two more caves,
both I believe with good paintings in, twenty miles
out of town, however I shall wait for Mr Hewitt's
opinion of them before we go out to do them.

I am also sending a pen & ink sketch of
the Mountain Top caves & snaps of the Goldspring
Mountain Tops & Blaaukrantz ones.
