REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE AWARD OF GOVERNMENT GRANTS IN AID OF RESEARCH.

- 1. Grants in aid of research shall be known as "Government Research Grants."
- 2. Grants shall be made only for the actual expenses of investigation, and are not intended to support the grantee while carrying out his research, but may be used for the payment of subsistence expenses while travelling in connection with his research. Unless previous permission has been sought and obtained no portion of a grant may be utilized for payment of travelling expenses to attend meetings of scientific societies. In certain cases grants may be made in aid of the publication of the results of research.
 - 3. Applications for grants shall be made direct to the Research Grant Board.
 - 4. Every application shall state:—
 - (a) The subject of research with a résumé of the work already done by the applicant and/or others in connexion with it, the direction in which the applicant proposes to proceed, the probable duration of the research, and, where possible, the results anticipated.
 - (b) The qualifications, including a record of previous research and publications thereon, of the applicant.
 - (c) The equipment and other facilities for the research proposed, already available.
 - (d) Any further equipment or facilities that would be necessary or desirable, with details of the expenditure proposed.
 - (e) Whether the applicant has asked for, or is receiving a grant from any other body.
- 5. The Board shall give careful consideration to every application, but shall not assign reasons for refusing to make grants applied for.
- 6. When a grant has been made for a specific purpose, it shall be used for that purpose only. If the grantee desires to change in any manner the subject of his research he shall make application to have the grant made available for the altered investigation.
- 7. A detailed account of the expenditure supported by vouchers shall be rendered annually to the Research Grant Board, and any balance shall be repaid.
- 8. All apparatus as well as surplus of material purchased by means of Government Research Grants shall remain the property of the Research Grant Board.
- 9. A report of the progress of the research shall be furnished annually by the grantee to the Research Board.
- 10. In any publication of the results of the research due acknowledgment must be made of the assistance received. The grantee shall furnish to the Research Grant Board such number of copies of the publication as it may require.
- 11. It shall be a condition of any grant made under these regulations that the grantee shall be liable to refund to the Board when required any grant awarded to him, if he has committed a breach of these regulations, and it shall be a further condition that the liability so to refund in the event of such breach is admitted when the grant is made.
- 12. Applications for grants in respect of the year / shall be received not later than and shall, as well as all other communications regarding grants, be addressed to the Secretary of the Research Grant Board, P.O. Box 7137, Johannesburg.
