Dear Dr. Scott:

The American Oriental Society has now published A Bushman Dictionary by the late Dorothea F. Bleek. We are, therefore, prepared to carry out the section of our agreement with Miss Bleek concerning the distribution of free copies. This calls for ten copies to be sent to the University of Capetown, ten copies to be sent to the South African Council for Social Research, and ten copies to Miss Bleek. We have a copy of your letter of March 16, 1953 to Professor Zellig S. Harris, indicating that you then expected Miss Bleek's personal copies to be sent to you. We write to ask whether you are still prepared to accept the ten personal copies which were due Miss Bleek in order to give them appropriate distribution.

The agreement also requires us to return any unused balance of the grant of 1000 to the donor. It now appears there will be a small balance after all expenses are paid. We are a little uncertain as to the exact name and address of the donor, since there is some difficulty in the wording of the name as it appears in our agreement and on the back of the title page of the work. We would be glad to have your statement to help us solve this problem/

The copy of your letter, mentioned above, furnished us with a list of twenty-four periodicals to which we are expected to send review copies. We shall proceed to send out these review copies at our earliest opportunity.

In our application for copyright we are required to state the citizenship of the author. Would you please let us know whether Miss Bleek was a citizen of the Union of South Africa or of some other country.
